- a. Dangerous or Unsightly Premises By-Law for Fundy Albert

## 11. NOTICES OF MOTION AND RESOLUTIONS

a. Motion relating to SERSC waste collection

WHEREAS the Provincial Solid Waste Collection contracts will be terminated in November of 2024; and

WHEREAS the Southeast Regional Service Commission is endeavoring to implement a Regional Solid Waste Collection Program; and

WHEREAS the Village of Fundy Albert will need to find an alternate solution to solid waste collection until a regional model is implemented;

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Council of the Village of Fundy Albert inform the Southeast Regional Service Commission of its intention to opt-in to a regional solid waste collection model to be managed by ECO360 starting February 1st, 2025 or earlier.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT** the Council of the Village of Fundy Albert approach the Southeast Regional Service Commission ECO 360 to provide assistance in contracting with a solid waste collection provider for Fundy Albert from November 2024, until a regional solid waste Collection solution is implemented.

WHEREAS the Union of Municipalities of New Brunswick has expressed their disappointment with the manner in which the provincial government has handled the situation; and

WHEREAS the municipality of Fundy Albert shares the concerns identified by the Union of Municipalities of New Brunswick;

**BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Council of the Village of Fundy Albert authorizes a letter to the Minister of Service New Brunswick expressing support for these concerns conveyed by the UMNB.
